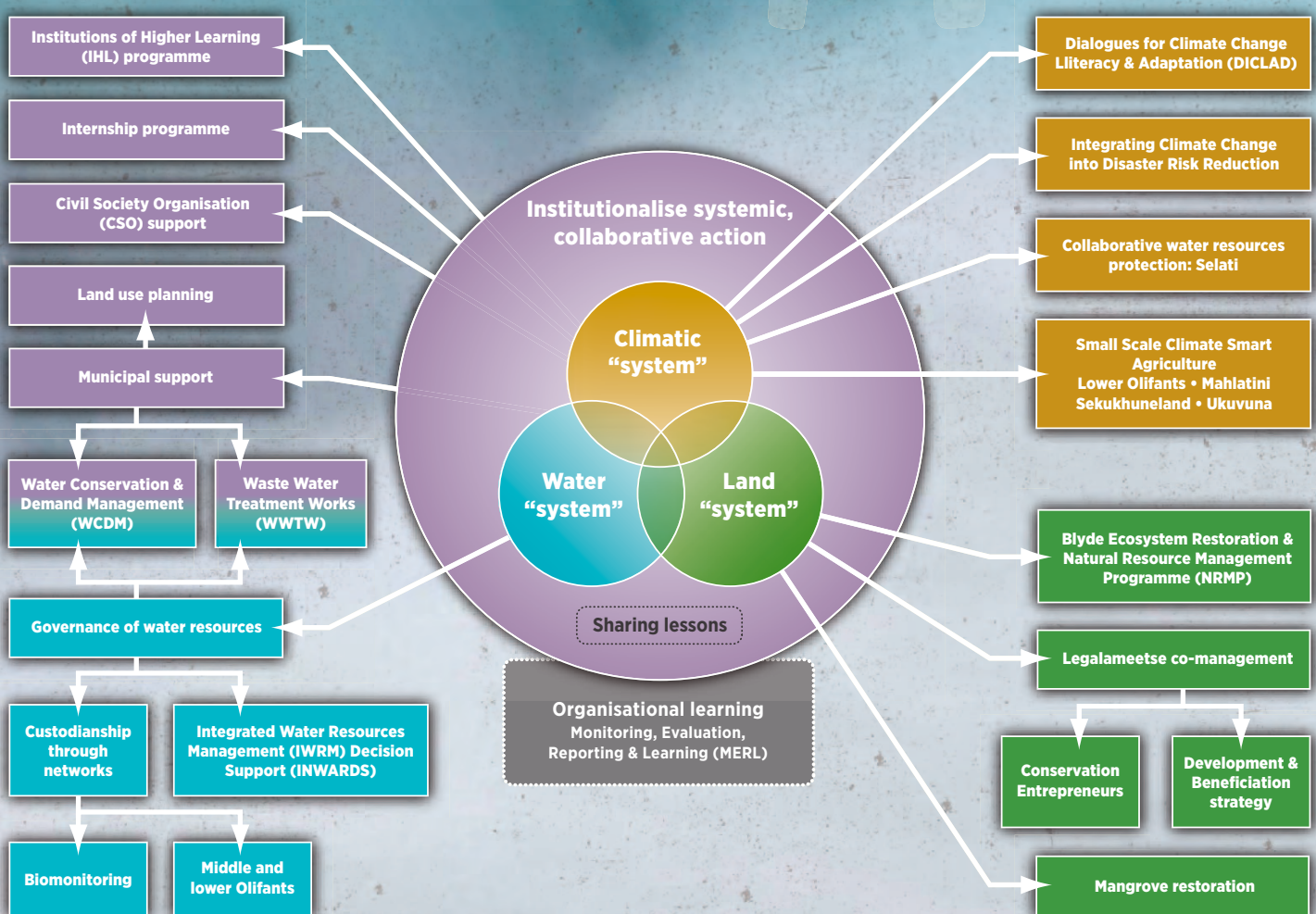


Overview of AWARD Resources

Green – *Land* focus area

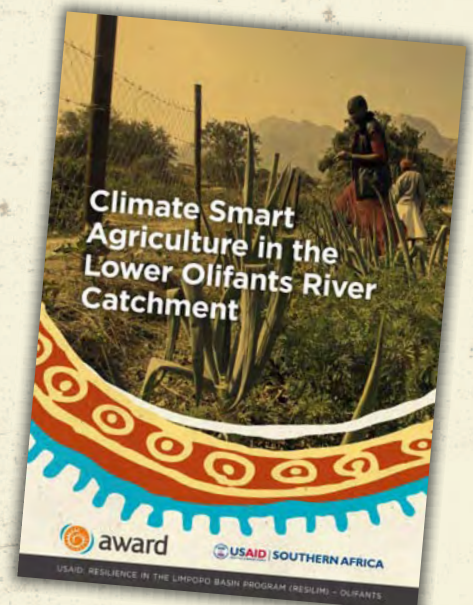


Technical Reports – detailed reports on different aspects of projects
